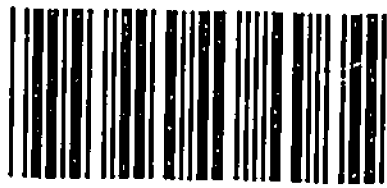

of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY in the *first* degree, committed as follows:

The said *David Snodgrass*

late of the First Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the
Eighteenth day of *September* in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and eighty-*four*, in the *night* time of the said day, at the Ward, City and
County aforesaid, with force and arms,

one watch of the value of

five dollars

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one *Frank W. Reynolds*,
on the person of *the said Frank W. Reynolds*,
then and there being found, from the person of the said *Frank W. Reynolds*,
then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the statute in such case
made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.
