S i r : -

In accordance with the request of your secretary, Mr. Adamson, made to Commissioner Maywald this morning, the Municipal Explosives Commission submits herewith a brief statement of the subject-matter that it had intended to present to you personally to-day.

This Commission desires an appropriation of \$6,000.00, to cover its fees and expenses for the year 1910. A resolution authorizing the issue of special revenue bonds to that amount and for that purpose was introduced in the Board of Aldermen at its first session in September. The resolution has been approved by the Finance Committee, but has not yet been acted upon by the Board. In aid of this resolution, and to expedite its passage, this Commission respectfully requests Your Honor to send a message to the Board of Aldermen, recommending favorable action thereon.

The matter of securing this additional sum was originally taken up with Commissioner Waldo before the unexpended balance of our predecessors had been exhausted; and in view of his statement that funds would be provided, this Commission has continued in its

work uninterruptedly. No payment on account of the fees or the expenses of the Commission has been made since July 31st, 1910.

As we understand that Your Honor has been informed by Commissioner Waldo of the exact condition of affairs, we will not burden you with further details.

It is expected that the resolution in question will come up for action by the Board of Aldermen to-morrow, November 15th, and we urgently request Your Honor to take the matter up with them at that time.
