

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

Edward Quinn

of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY in the *second* degree, committed as follows:

The said *Edward Quinn*,

late of the First Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *fourteenth* day of *March*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-*five*, in the *day* time of the said day, at the Ward, City and County aforesaid, with force and arms,

one pocket watch of the value of ten cents,
one silver coin of the United States of the
kind known as half-dollars, of the value
of fifty cents,
one other silver coin of the United States
of the kind known as quarter-dollars,
of the value of twenty-five cents,
five other silver coins of the United States
of the kind known as dimes, of the
value of ten cents each,
and one nickel coin of the United
States, of the kind known as five-cent
pieces, of the value of five cents,

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one *Oddie North*
on the person of *the said Oddie North*
then and there being found, from the person of the said *Oddie North*,
then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the statute in such case
made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.
