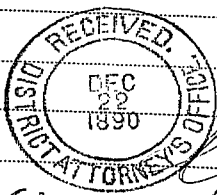

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse
William Joyce and Adolph Killebrecht
of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY in the first degree committed as follows:

The said William Joyce and Adolph Killebrecht, both

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the fifteenth
day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
ninety, in the night - time of the said day, at the City and County
aforesaid, with force and arms,

one watch of the
value of thirty dollars

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one Michael Nolan
on the person of the said Michael Nolan
then and there being found, from the person of the said Michael Nolan
then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the statute in such
case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their
dignity.
