

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

Joseph Quinn

of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY IN THE *second* DEGREE, committed as follows :

The said

Joseph Quinn

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *sixteenth* day of *January* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *ninety*, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms,

one overcoat of the value of twenty-five dollars, and one coat of the value of fifteen dollars

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one *Patrick Grogan*

then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.
