

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse Frank Allen and Frank Smith of the crime of attempting to commit the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY in the first degree, committed as follows:

The said Frank Allen and Frank Smith

late of the First Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the tenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in the night time of the said day, at the Ward, City and County aforesaid, with force and arms,

Two silver coins of the United States, to the said persons as aforesaid, of the value of ten cents each.
