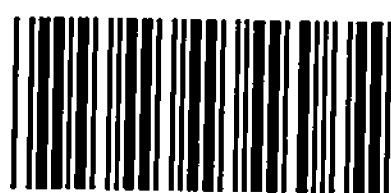

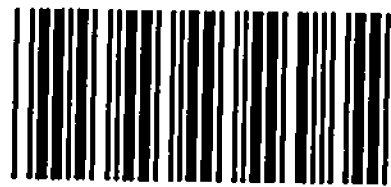

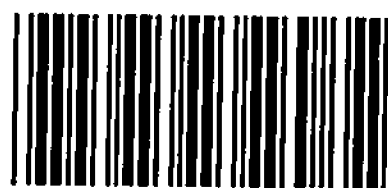

late of the City and County of New York, on the eight day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two ~~with force and arms, at the City and County aforesaid, and on divers other~~

days, were and yet are common gamblers; and they, the said Albert J. Adams, John Clark, George Marsello, John Bergen and George Pryor, on the day and in the year aforesaid, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms, in a certain room in a certain building known as number One Hundred and two West Thirty-second Street in said City and County, feloniously did unlawfully keep and exhibit a certain gambling table and certain cards, chips, devices and apparatus, a more particular description whereof is to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, and cannot now be given, the same being suitable for gambling purposes, and which were then and there intended to be used for gambling purposes, against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.

Adams, John Clark, and George Marsells ~~did~~ <sup>keep and exhibit and</sup> with keeping and exhibiting for gambling purposes certain tables, establishment, device and apparatus, in a certain banking game where money was dependent on the result.

A more particular description is as follows; that Albert J. Adams, and John Clark did, at, in and upon certain premises known as 102 West 32<sup>nd</sup> Street, keep and exhibit and permit to be used for gambling purposes, a certain establishment, device and apparatus for gambling at a certain banking game, commonly called "Roulette".

And that the said John Clark in the presence of the said Albert J. Adams did deal at said "Roulette".

And that the said George Marsells did aid and assist the said Albert J. Adams and John Clark by

acting as Door Keeper, on outside Lookout, opening and closing the door for people to go in and out of said premises where said gambling game was conducted, while the said John Clark did deal at "Roulette".

And deponent further says, that in and upon the said premises at the dates aforesaid, there was also kept and exhibited by Albert J. Adams, John Clark, George Marsells, John Bergen and George Pryon, certain establishment, tables, device and apparatus for the purpose of gambling in a certain banking game where money was dependent upon the result; the said banking game being what is commonly called "Red and Black" or "Rouge et Noir", and that in the same room with the Roulette, while the Roulette was being conducted, the said John Bergen and George Pryon did deal for others to gamble at the game of Red and Black or Rouge et Noir
