During a fight which took place on board of the Italian Bark "Afreddo", M. Rossi Matter, now lodging at Pier 53 East River, Domenico Pandolfi, the Steward, was stabbed in the shoulder, by Vincenzo Porretti, who, soon afterwards, was arrested by an officer of the Delancey Street Station.

Yesterday the prisoner was arraigned in the Essex Market Police Court and Justice Duffy, in default of \$1000 bail committed him to answer at General Sessions the charge of felonious assault.

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

Solomon Volasky

of the CRIME OF Torturing animals, —

committed as follows:

The said Solomon Volasky, —

late of the Sixth Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the seventeenth day of May, — in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, at the Ward, City and County aforesaid, with force and arms, certain animals and living creatures, to wit: nine ducks, unlawfully wickedly and cruelly did torture, by then and there wickedly and cruelly confining and keeping confined, the said ducks in a certain wooden box of insufficient proportions to permit the said ducks so confined therein, to stand therein in their natural and accustomed position, or to allow of their moving about without great pain and discomfort; and the said ducks, so confined in the said box, unlawfully, wickedly and cruelly did keep confined, and continue to confine therein, for a space of time, to wit: for the space of one hour and more; whereby great and
