S i r :-

In relation to character and manner of conducting Concert Saloon at #302 Bowery, I desire to report that I have had the place under strict observation for some time, with the following result.

At about 9 P.M. June 2nd.1897, Officer Anthony F. Bolz visited the Lyceum Concert Hall of Otto Urnstein at #302 Bowery: there was a female on the stage, singing, and dressed in theatrical costume; while Officer Bolz was sitting in the Auditorium, another female performer who was dressed in theatrical costume, and sitting in the balcony, sent a waiter to him and requested him to come on the balcony.

Officer Bolz went to the woman and was asked by her to treat, he ordered three (3) bottles of lager beer, for which he paid 75 cents, and during his conversation with the woman, was informed by her that she was compelled by the Manager to sit on the balcony between acts, and solicit men for the purpose of purchasing drinks.

He again visited the place about 11 P.M. June 4th.1897, and was solicited from the Auditorium by the same woman who was sitting in the balcony: She asked him to treat to beer and cigarettes, this he did, and after receiving the cigarettes, she and another woman commenced smoking, she asked him if he would call on her Sunday, giving her name and address as Georgie Leonard #7 St.Marks Place; during the evening he saw a man do a song and dance on the stage.


He also visited the place Saturday evening, June 5th., and was called by the woman who was sitting in the balcony, but a waiter told the woman "the proprietor would not let any one upstairs," as there was two detectives in the place.

Officers John Steller and James Rogers visited the place about 11 P.M. June 5th and saw a man dancing on the stage.

Officers Anthony J. Miller and Robert B. Watt visited the place about 9:30 P.M., June 2nd.1897, and saw two men dancing and also saw a woman dance on the stage: They subsequently witnessed Officer Bolz drinking with two of the female performers on the balcony.

In conclusion, as it is a violation of the provisions of the Concert license, I would respectfully recommend that the matter be referred to his Honor the Mayor, with a view to the revocation of the same.



