term of a certain saloon liquor license, class *7* No. *2459* issued
by the late Commissioners of Excise of the City of New York, on the *79th*
day of *October* 189*5*, to *William S. Long* for
use upon the premises No. *7450 Third Avenue*
in the City of New York,

which said license expires by its terms on the *26th* day of *October*
189*6*; together with the right to sue for, receive and recover from the City of

cation, hereby ratifying and confirming all that the said attorney or its substitute
shall lawfully do, or cause to be done by virtue hereof.
