That *Louis Tekulsky*  
of the City, County and State of New York, for value received have sold, and do hereby grant, assign and convey to James Everard all moneys that are to be paid and received or that may be due and recoverable for the unexpired term of a certain Saloon Liquor License Class *2* No. *3936* issued by the late ~~of~~ Commissioners of Excise of the City of New York, on the *1<sup>st</sup>* day of *December* 189*5* to me for use on premises No. *33* *Monroe Street* in the City of New York, which license by its terms expires on *December 1<sup>st</sup> 1896* together with the right to sue for, receive and recover from the City of New York, such proportion of the whole license fee paid for said license as the remainder of the term for which said license would have run were it not for the passage of the Liquor Tax Law bears to the whole time for which said license was issued; and also my right, title and interest in and to said license and all moneys due, or to become due and payable thereunder pursuant to Section 4 Chapter 112 of the Laws of 1896, or otherwise,


