STATEMENT FOR STREET PREACHER'S PERMIT.

The Mayor, in his discretion, may issue written permits allowing a "clergyman or minister of any denomination" to preach in the streets of the City. (Sec. 777, Art. XLIII, Ord.) Information upon each of the following items must be filed in the Mayor's Office:

As the Mayor has no authority to grant permits to a person who is not a clergyman or minister of some denomination, it will be necessary in each instance for an applicant who is not the pastor of some city church, to obtain and attach to this application and file with it, a letter from some pastor or some religious body or church workers' society conducting religious work in the City of New York, certifying that the applicant is a clergyman or minister, and recommending the granting of the application.
