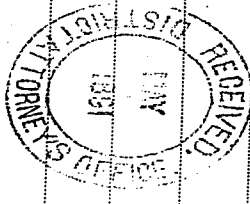

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK,

against

THE GRAND JURY OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF NEW YORK, by this  
indictment, accuse *Sigmund Unger*

of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY in the *second* degree committed as follows:

The said

*Sigmund Unger*

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *twenty-ninth*  
day of *April* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and  
ninety *one* at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms,

*one watch of the value of sixty  
dollars, one chain of the value of  
twenty dollars, and one silver coin of  
the United States of America of  
the kind called dollars, of the value  
of one dollar*

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one

*Sigmund Unger*

then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against  
the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People  
of the State of New York and their dignity.
