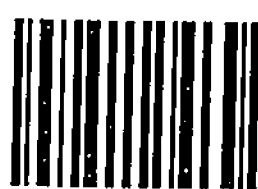

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment,
accuse *Charles M. Zeiger*

of the CRIME of *Selling Spirituous Liquors, without a License,*
committed as follows:

The said *Charles M. Zeiger*

late of the *First* Ward of the City of New York, in the County of
New York aforesaid, on the *twenty-ninth* day of *November* in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty *three*, at the Ward,
City and County aforesaid, certain strong and spirituous liquors, and certain wines, *ale and beer,* to
wit: one gill of wine, one gill of brandy, one gill of rum, one gill of gin, one gill of
whiskey, one gill of cordial, one gill of bitters, one gill of ale, one gill of porter, one gill
of beer, one gill of lager beer, and one gill of a certain strong and spirituous liquor
to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, unlawfully did sell, in quantity less than five gallons
at one time, to

~~and to certain other~~ persons whose names are to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, without
having a license therefor, as required by law, contrary to the form of the statute in such case
made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the People of the State of New
York.
