The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse Andrew Young

of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY IN THE ~~First~~ DEGREE, committed as follows:

The said Andrew Young

late of the First Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York, aforesaid, on the 26th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, at the Ward, City and County aforesaid, with force and arms

in the night time of said day, one promissory note for the payment of money of the kind known as United States Treasury notes, the same being then and there due and unsatisfied for the payment of and of the value of five dollars, one promissory note for the payment of money of the kind known as United States Treasury notes, the same being then and there due and unsatisfied for the payment of and of the value of one dollar

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one Frank Osborn on the person of the said Frank Osborn then and there being found, from the person of the said

Frank Osborn

then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.
