Dear Sir:-

In compliance with your directions of August 9th, I have conferred with Dr. L. K. Neff, President of the Medical Board, and we beg to report as follows:-

We have, each of us visited the Strauss Laboratory at 151 Avenue C and have carefully inspected every process connected with the Plant. The quality of the Milk and barley water is standard. The apparatus and plant are the best in the City. There is only one preparation of his, namely sterilized plain milk that could be used with benefit in the Infants' Hospital, of which 250 quart bottles per day can be utilized to good advantage.

What is more important (in order to lower the number of deaths which occur in children under six months of age) would be the necessity of putting up formulae to order, of which the ingredients are cream, milk, sugar, Sugar of milk, lime water and water. For these constituent there are about fourteen different formulae now in use, arranged according to the age and condition of the Infant.

These formulae are subject to change daily according to the progress of disease or recovery therefrom. Milk foods are prescribed for these infants as carefully as medicine and compounded with equal difficulty. The formulae prescribed for the premature born children contain almost the minimum of fat, sugar and proteids, viz:- .0.50 fat; .3 sugar; .50 proteids. Pure milk contains 4 parts fat; 4.50 sugar xxxxxcxxx and 4 proteids. Thus it may be seen the formulae presented by Mr. Strauss to the city cannot be utilized except in the case of pure plain milk which we already mentioned. Each bottle must be labeled with a description of its contents and have the name of the child it is intended for attached to it that no mistakes can occur.

In case Mr. Strauss should not approve of making up our formulae in his laboratory, if he will kindly furnish us with twenty quart bottles of cream per day (16 per cent) we will be able to make up the

3. Milk inspection. - All the cows and condensed milk received by the Department is inspected and tested daily, and none is accepted which is not sweet and stands the necessary tests when received. The condensed milk is subjected to periodical analysis.

The cows' milk received by this Department is as good as the best brought into the City. Of course, all that an inspector or chemist can do, when examining milk, is to see that it is sweet and unadulterated, at the time he examines it. He cannot tell whether the milk is 8 hours or 24 hours or 36 hours old, nor can he fortell how long it will be until it sours. This is particularly the case in Summer. Milk which has passed every test, say at 6 o'clock in the morning when examined on the Dock at the foot of East 26th St. may be found to have turned a few hours afterwards, when it is examined at the Institution to which it has been shipped. Milk, in fact, begins to change from the moment when it has been taken from the udder of the cow. At first the change is slight, but after some time it progresses more rapidly, and this change is hastened by hot weather, by violent agitation (on railroads) trains, trucks, etc.) and by electrical conditions of the atmosphere. It is well known that a large proportion of even the best country milk brought into the city during this season will not stand boiling, because it has already progressed too far on the road of lactic acid fermentation, though this may not yet be perceptible to the senses."

I have the honor to submit for your information, and through you for the information of the Honorable Board of Commissioners, Comparative Per Capita Statement of the Incurable Hospital Department of Alms House, for the first six months for the past six years, commencing January 1st, 1892.

This statement shows the average census and the amounts expended for provisions, clothing and bedding, salaries, liquors, drugs and Surgucal instruments, fuel and misceallaneous articles, showing the total average amount expended monthly, and the daily per capita cost.

To recapitulate the figures for the Incurable Hospital, we find the following facts:-

These figures show that during the first half year of 1897, we have supported a census of 17 more persons, per day, than in year 1892, at a reduction in total average monthly expense of ~~XXXXXX~~ \$97.61 or a saving of nearly 6 cents per day, per patient, and a saving under year of 1895 of \$220.86, on same basis, or a trifle over 8 cents per day, yet we supported 13 more patients, per day, this year, than in year 1895.

You are informed that this reduction or saving was not effected by the curtailing of provisions or clothing, on the contrary we have this year allowed more and better provisions, more and better clothing than in former years; amongst some of them I might mention the fact of the substitution of Granulated sugar for Brown, better grades of tea and coffee, and better grades of wearing apparel.

RESOLVED:- That the Superintendent of Bellevue Hospital be and he hereby is authorized to obtain estimates for metal ceilings necessary in the wards of Bellevue Hospital for a sum not to exceed \$2,500. bills for which work are to be presented to the faculty of the Bellevue Hospital Medical College for their acceptance and payment, the amount for this work to be credited to the Repair Account for 1897.

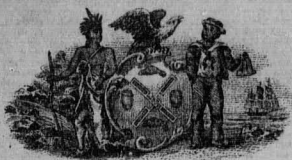

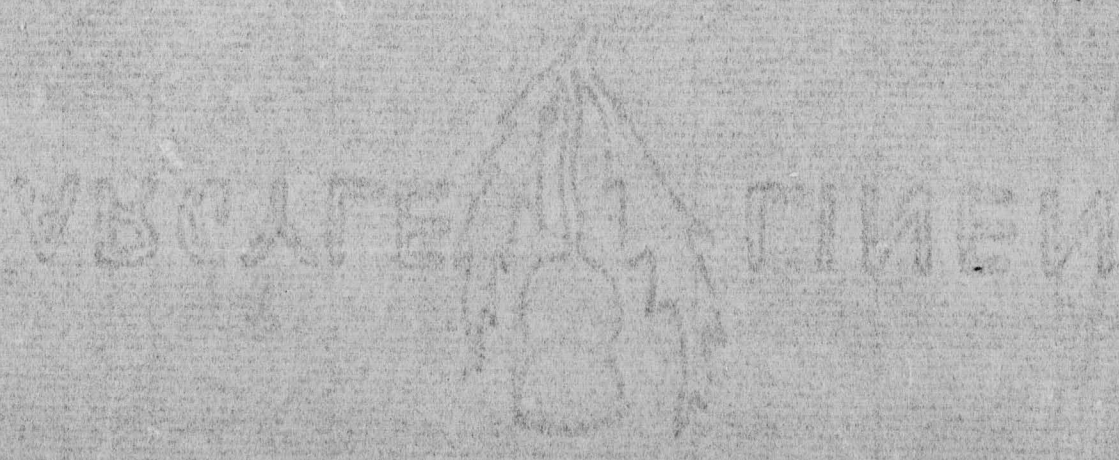
