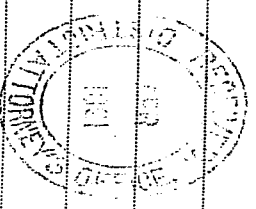

My name is Jimmie Isaacs I
am a niece of Louis Isaacs the
defendant in the above matter I
was born in Russian Poland I am
now twenty two years of age my
father and the defendant are brothers
My uncle sent for me to live in his
family about four and a half years
ago I lived in his family consisting
of himself his wife and seven children
for four years and three months
my wages were ten dollars a month
during my stay at my uncle's house
I received altogether including my
passage money which he paid about
eighty seven dollars about six months
ago I left my uncle's employ and
he gave me a note for seventy seven
dollars for two hundred and fifty
dollars when it became due it was
protested. It was made payable at
my uncle's house instead of at the
Bowery Bank where he does business
Several days after that I called at
his store and asked for payment of
the note. He ordered his son to make
out a cheque for two hundred and fifty
dollars to give to me which he did
and which my uncle signed my cousin
had put my name on the back so
that I could make a mark because
I cannot write. I gave up the note

and my uncle tore it up and then asked me for a receipt which I refused to give and I did not take it. I do not believe that my uncle intended to stage the note and I believe that if I had taken the cheque for the two hundred and fifty dollars I could have gotten the money for it at the Bowery Bank where it was made payable. My uncle did not intend to wrong me and I desire to withdraw the further prosecution of this case. Had I given the matter greater consideration than I did I would not have had my uncle arrested and troubled. I therefore most respectfully ask that this indictment may be dismissed.
