of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY IN THE *second* DEGREE, committed  
as follows:

day of *November* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *eighty-*  
*nine*, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms,

*four watches of the value  
of seven dollars and fifty  
cents each*

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one

*Julius Weiss*

then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away,  
against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of  
the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.
