The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

William Elliot

of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY in the second degree, committed as follows:

The said William Elliot

late of the First Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York, aforesaid, on the 23rd day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, at the Ward, City and County aforesaid, with force and arms

one satchel of the value of one dollar and fifty cents, one album of the value of one dollar and fifty cents, one shawl of the value of three dollars, one cap of the value of ten dollars, six handkerchiefs of the value of seventy five cents each one pair of trousers of the value of five dollars, two jackets of the value of two dollars each, and three undershirts of the value of one dollar each

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one John Madorski

then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.

being duly sworn, deposes and says, that on the 23 day of October 1885

at the City of New York, in the County of New York, was feloniously taken, stolen and carried away from the possession of deponent in the day time

the following property, viz :

one leather Satchel of the value of one \$7.00  
one Album of the value of one \$0.75  
one Silk Showl. of the value of three dollars  
one seal skin Cap of the value of ten dollars  
a Sinner Handkerchief of the value of four dollars
