Grant's death and arranged for the military reception of the remains in this City, and took an active part in arranging for the subsequent funeral obsequies, having charge of the military & naval salutes &c. &c.

I am a Veteran Officer of the late War, having served from the beginning to the End of the war & having received the Medal of Honor

from Congress for bravery in action, on the
recommendation of the General Commanding
the Army of the U. S.

The last time Gen. Grant & Gen. Sheridan
were seen together in public, was on the occa-
sion of their honoring me with their presence,
& in receiving my Parade, while Grand Marshal
of the G. A. R. in the City of Brooklyn.

I will esteem it a great honor to
become a factor in the concluding arrangements
for paying this great tribute of respect to my
old Commanded and beloved friend,

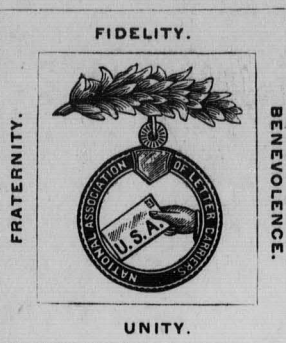
