of the City, County and State of New York, for value received, have sold,  
and by these presents do grant, assign and convey unto the *Bararian*  
*Star Brewing Company* a domestic corporation having its principal  
place of business in the City of New York in said State, all moneys that are  
to be paid and received or that may be due and recoverable for the unexpired  
term of a certain saloon liquor license, class *2* No. *5916* issued  
by the late Commissioners of Excise of the City of New York, on the *18<sup>th</sup>*  
day of *February* 189*6*, to *Louis Hamburg.* for  
use upon the premises No. *360 Tenth Avenue*  
in the City of New York,

which said license expires by its terms on the *14<sup>th</sup>* day of *February*  
189*6*; together with the right to sue for, receive and recover from the City of  
New York such proportion of the whole license fee paid for the said license as  
the remainder of the term for which the said license would have run, were it

to Section 4, Chapter 112 of the Laws of 1896, or otherwise.

*Brewing Company* its successors and assigns forever, to and for the use of the  
said *Bararian Star Brewing Company* — its successors and  
assigns, hereby constituting and appointing the said *Bararian Star*  
*Brewing Company* — my true and lawful attorney irrevocably  
in my name, place and stead, for the purpose aforesaid, to ask, demand,  
sue for, attach, levy, recover and receive all such sum and sums of money which now  
are, or may hereafter become due, owing and payable for or on account of all or any  
of the accounts, dues, debts and demands above assigned, giving and granting unto  
the said attorney, full power and authority to do and perform all and every act and  
thing whatsoever requisite and necessary, as fully to all intents and purposes as I  
might or could do if personally present, with full power of substitution and revo-  
cation, hereby ratifying and confirming all that the said attorney or its substitute  
shall lawfully do, or cause to be done by virtue hereof.
