We, the undersigned, businessmen of Division Street and tax-payers of the City of New York, hereby respectfully petition your Honor to see that Division Street, between Chatham Square and Pike Street, be made safe and available for use by the public of the City of New York.

Division Street, between the aforesaid streets, has been practically closed up to the public for a great length of time, owing to the construction of the Manhattan Bridge. Businessmen of many years good standing have thereby been ruined. This was for the benefit of the Community, and the businessmen, as a part of the community, had to give their sacrifices. But all the construction work necessary for the Bridge has been completed, but the street has been left in a dangerous condition, broken up and full of impediments and holes. All that was left to be done to make the street available for use was repaving, which could have been done long ago.

We respectfully request your Honor to urge the proper authorities to commence repaving the street and progress with the work as speedily as convenient, for the welfare of the public, for the benefit of the property owners, and for the convenience of the residents and advantage of the merchants of Division Street.

Respected Sir:-

We the undersigned retail merchants, having our places of business on the westerly side of Fifth Avenue between Warren Street and St. Marks Avenue in the Borough of Brooklyn, City of New York, most respectfully call your attention to the fact that the streets in front of our places of business have been torn up and piles of dirt five feet high deposited on the sidewalk for more than ten days past, leaving only about three feet of sidewalk in front of our stores. The street crossings barely permit of their being used for that purpose, and that no work whatever has been done on this job for a week past.

At this season of the year with the Holidays approaching this condition of the streets will mean disaster to us and our business and we humbly petition you to cause such immediate steps to be taken as will result in these excavations being filled in and the sidewalks cleared of dirt within the earliest possible period.




