



Court of General Sessions of the Peace

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK,

against

William H. Valentine

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse *William H. Valentine*

of the CRIME OF GRAND LARCENY IN THE *second* DEGREE, committed as follows:

The said *William H. Valentine*,

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *ninth* day of *March*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-*nine*, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms,

one watch of the value of thirty dollars, and three tickets, each entitling the holder thereof to a passage upon a railway car (a more particular description of which said tickets is to the Grand Jury aforesaid in memory of the value of one dollar each,

of the goods, chattels and personal property of one *Maund Post*,

then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.
