Street, Ward, in the City and County aforesaid, the said being a Butcher and which was occupied by Solomon Schwarzschild as a shop where meat and country goods were kept for sale and were **BURGLARIOUSLY** broken open and entered by means of forcing and breaking a bolt off the rear door of said shop and entering the same with intent to steal

on the night of the 31st day of August 1880 and the following property feloniously taken, stolen and carried away:

A quantity of meat of the value of fifty dollars

deponent's brother the property of deponent Abraham Schwarzschild and deponent further says, that he has great cause to believe, and does believe, that the aforesaid **BURGLARY** was committed, and the aforesaid property taken, stolen and carried away by Henry Zimmerman (now here)

for the reasons following, to wit: That the above described property was contained in the premises above described, which were securely locked and fastened on the said 31st day of August at seven o'clock

of the 1st day of September 1880
deponent found the said premises
broken open and the aforesaid
property stolen therefrom. That
deponent is informed by Officer
James Dugally of the 28th Precinct
that he saw said Zimmerman
in said premises on said night.

in the morning of the 1st day of
September 1880 deponent saw
a man in the back part of
the store No 245-3rd Avenue
occupied by ~~Abraham~~ Schwarzak
said man having a lighted candle
in his hand, that deponent tried
the front door of said store, when
the candle was put out and
the man ran out to the yard,
deponent then went through
the hallway adjoining and
heard someone going over
the fence. That deponent was
informed by Officer Charles
Hogarty of the 19th Precinct
that he (Hogarty) saw the
prisoner Henry Zimmerman
coming out of an alley way
at 205 East 58th Street at about
two o'clock of said morning, deponent

was also informed by Solomon
Schwarzschid that he Solomon
suspecter said Zimmerman
and the description given deponent
of said Zimmerman ^{and in size & appearance} answering to
the man seen by deponent in said
store. Deponent arrested said
Zimmerman, who at the time

Candle in his possession. In the
deponent found a quantity of meat in the
pocket of his pants, of the price of


