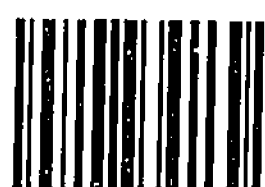

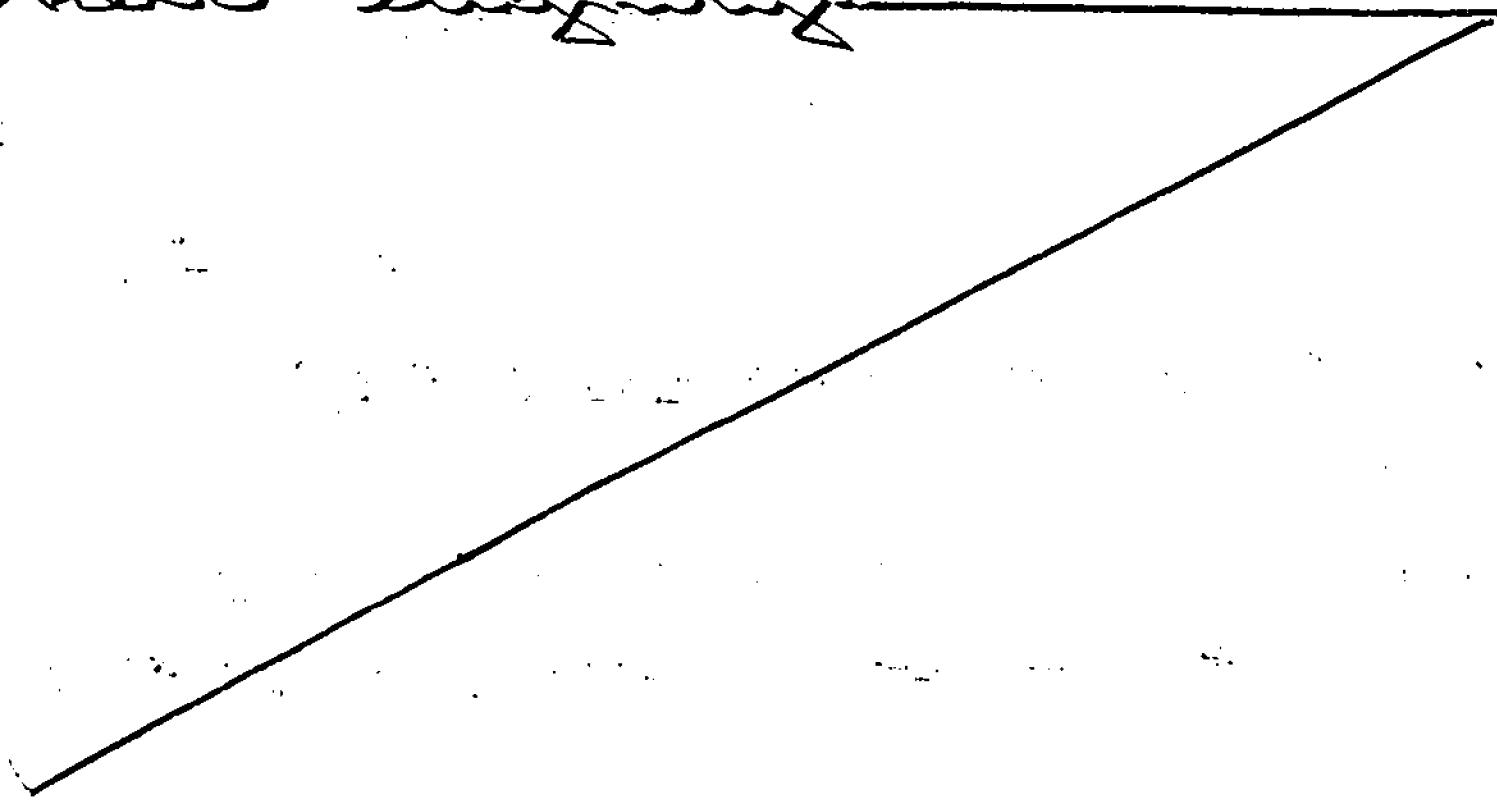

Edward Jewell aged 13 years 1977-3^d Ave.

On May 15, 1884 about 11.50 A.M. I saw Michael Healy standing in the hall doorway of No. 1977-3 Ave. The door was locked and I could not get in, then Michael Ahearn opened the door for me I went in and saw a man lying in the hall face downwards. Ahearn said never mind the man he is drunk, then James Brady came down the stairs and I went up and looked back and saw said Brady pick up the man's coat and search the pockets, he then put the coat under his arm & walked out with Ahearn. I then went up stairs and told my mother and the neighbors

0909

Annie Maher aged 40 years 1977 - 3^d Ave.

On May 15. 1884 I was attending bar in the store No. 1977 Third Ave. about 11.30 A.M. the three prisoners and an old man, I believe Joseph Barling is his name, were there drinking and talking. The old man seemed to be tight, he was sitting on a chair. The two biggest of the prisoners took him out the back door into the hall, I said handle him gently. About 20 minutes after a woman came in for ale and said that a man was killed out in the hallway. I went out and saw a Policeman there. The dead man was the same old man who had been in my saloon with the three prisoners. When they took the old man out he had his coat and shoes on, and when I saw him in the hall he did not have them.

Alfred Simon aged 23 years. Pawnbroker 2216 - 2^d Ave.
On May 15. 1884 at 12.20 P.M. Michael Ahearn
and Michael Haley came into my store and
pledged a silver watch, a pair of shoes and one
coat for \$5.00 said Ahearn gave the name of
O'Brien. He asked for more money on said property
which I refused, after consulting together they
agreed to take above amount, which I gave
to Ahearn and they left together. I afterwards
delivered them to the Police. I identify the
articles here shown me.

Henry White aged 16 years 73^d St. near Ave. A.
I drive a junk wagon for Michael Haley,
on May 15. 1884 I saw said Haley walking on
2^d Ave. + 115th St. with James Brady + Michael Ahearn.
I was driving said junk wagon, Ahearn came +
threw a coat in the wagon, Haley told Ahearn to
take said coat out which he did, they walked
away together, and Haley told me to drive away

Harry C. Barling aged 30 years 165 East 112 St.

I identify the watch, shoes and coat and the pocket book containing pawn tickets, (here shown) as the property of my father Joseph Barling who was found dead in the hallway of No. 1977 Third Avenue.

George Gries

2188 - 2d Ave.

On May 15, 1884 about 12.30 P.M. Michael Ahearn, Michael Haley and James Brady came to my saloon together and ordered drinks. Haley asked for dice he and Brady threw, & Brady lost, but refused to pay, then Ahearn paid and gave me \$1, he gave Brady 25 & Haley 35 cents. Haley said "You son of bitch you skinned me" Ahearn opened his coat & said "Search me I did not make any more than that, what more do you want". He treated again they again threw dice and had some disagreement about the payment for the drinks. They then fought with one another. Ahearn kicked Haley in the face & Brady struck him with a chair. I went for the Police & Ahearn and Brady ran out & left Haley unconscious. Ahearn & Brady jumped on a passing car.

Michael A. O'Donnell 2211-2^d Ave.

I am employed in a grocery at 2295-2^d Ave.
On May 15, 1884 about 1.20 P.M. Mrs Katie Kries
told me to run after a 2^d Ave. car & have Ahearn
& Brady arrested as they had nearly killed a man
in her husbands saloon, I ran after the car
& had the two men arrested at 2^d Ave. & 91 St.
by Officers Brady & Jordan.

Officer Thomas Brady 19th Precinct

I arrested Ahearn & Brady on a Second
Ave. car on May 15, 1884 at about 1.30 P.M.
Ahearn had blood on his shoes, and Brady had
blood on his face

Captain John Sanders 23^d Precinct

On May 15, 1884 about 2 P.M. Ahearn & Brady
were brought in. I had them searched & found
the pocket book, a one dollar bill & two pawn tickets
on Brady.

Officer Edward O'Hara

23^d Precinct

On May 15, 1884 betw. 12.30 & 12.45 P.M. I was told a man was dead in the hallway No 1977-3^d Av. I found the man lying with his head towards 3^d Ave. I asked if any one knew him. They did not. His coat and shoes were missing and his pockets were turned inside out. I did not discover any blood stains around. I noticed his neck was a little swollen on the left side.

Dr. Philip E. Donlin Deputy Coroner.

On May 16, 1884 at 169 E. 122^d Street I made a post mortem examination of the body of Joseph Barling and found.

Contusions on the inside of both arms.

The face, neck & upper part of the chest were suffused with blood.

There was an extravasation of blood, the size of a pea on the right outer edge of the right eye.

There was a spot of extravasated blood immediately over the 2^d rib at its junction with the sternum about the size of a five cent piece.

On opening the thorax, the lungs were found oedematous. The heart was hypertrophied and the Aortic Valves insufficient.

09 14

The liver showed fatty degeneration and the kidneys were congested.

The stomach was inflamed and showed also venous congestion.

On removing the scalp, there was an extravasation of blood the size of a three cent piece at the apex of the head.

On removing the calvarium, the Dura Mater was slightly thickened and the Arachnoid was found lifted from the brain by a thick serous effusion and over the ~~brain~~ anterior convolutions of the cerebrum on the right side there was a clot of blood about 3 inches in length and 2 inches wide and about an eighth of an inch in thickness.

From said Autopsy I find death due to, coma from cerebral apoplexy.
