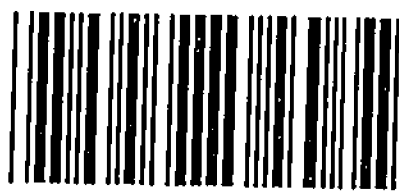

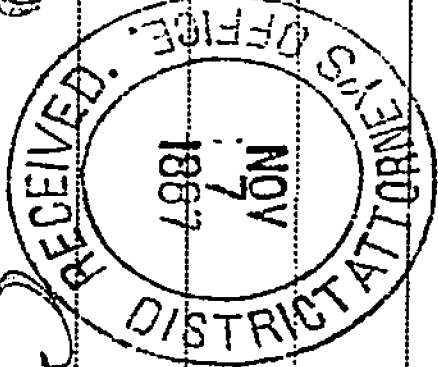

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

*Joseph R. Ranco* —

of the CRIME of *Assault in the Third Degree*. —

committed as follows:

The said *Joseph R. Ranco*,

late of the *First* Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *second* day of *November*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty *seven*, at the Ward, City and County aforesaid,

*in and upon one Nellie Asposito, then and there being, unlawfully and indecently did make an assault, and did then and there unlawfully, indecently and against the will of her the said Nellie Asposito, put and place the hands of him the said Joseph Ranco upon and against the person and private parts of her the said Nellie Asposito, against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity*
