sworn, says: That she is the mother of Andrew Jauch, who has  
been indicted under the name of Andrew Youck.

2 That the said defendant, Youck, is now nineteen  
years of age, and is the only support that deponent has, and  
has been deponent's support for the last four years, support-  
ing this ~~plaintiff~~ <sup>deponent</sup>, his mother, and two younger children, who  
are depending upon deponent for support, being aged respect-  
ively, fourteen and eleven years, who are not able to earn  
anything as yet, nor have any work, or do earn anything at  
the present time.

3 That her said son, prior to the arrest in this  
case, has never been arrested in all his life excepting once,  
for playing ball on the streets; that he has at all times  
~~been~~ <sup>being</sup> a good, dutiful and obedient child; has given to de-  
ponent all his earnings; and that just prior to the time of  
his arrest, he had been out of work for about two months,  
having been ill at the time, and being out of work.

That this deponent is a widow, her husband being  
dead; that she is very poor; has no means whatever; has  
no income; has no money or valuables, or any source from

which she received her means of support, excepting as such as she receives through the work of her said son, and the wages that he earns and hands over to her.

4 That deponent is informed that her said son, at the time of the alleged commission of the crime in this action, was under the influence of drink; but deponent says that her said son has never been a drinking man, or addicted to the use of liquor, but to her own knowledge, has always been sobre, industrious, honest and faithful; and deponent does not know any other occasion on which her said son was intoxicated excepting the one which is mentioned at the time of the crime committed as alleged in this action.

of the value of fifteen dollars each*

of the goods, chattels, and personal property of one *Annie E. Smith*  
in the dwelling house of the said *Annie E. Smith*

there situate, then and there being found, from the dwelling house aforesaid, then and  
there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the Statute in  
such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New  
York, and their dignity.
