



If you like, I may be able to provide the name ^{address} of a fellower of Malcolm who told me, without any prompting, that he saw ^{both} Butler and Johnson inside the Audubon Ballroom well before the shooting started. The gentleman in question did not testify in court. To my knowledge, he was not questioned by the police.

Spoke to Bruce Perry. Told him I could send him B+J's criminal records. He also wanted Grand Jury testimony. Told him all I could send was Benjamin Goodman's since that was now public record due to 440.10 motion, & I had already sent it to 60 Min. Perry didn't know about 60 Min - gave him names of Mike Wallace & Alan Maragnes.

Perry told me he spoke 2 1/2 yrs ago to a "Brother Jamil" (only name Perry knows him by) & Jamil said he had seen B+J walk into Audubon Ballroom some well before the murder. When they spoke, Jamil lived at 3333 B'dway (¹²⁵~~100~~ St), Apt. 70, Bldg C (212-926-1848), & that Jamil, until recently at least, works for Nyc Dept. of Parks, Park Dist. 12A, Highbridge (212-397-9197).

Perry also told me he's found a personal notice for B+J to kill M. M was minister of Mosq. 7. In late 50's

captains were under control of ministers like M, & the captains controlled the thugs (Fruit of Islam?). But, in early 60's, captains now were to report directly to Chicago HQ, bypassing individual ministers like M. Mosq. 7 thugs under control of Capt. Joseph. B + J were thugs under Joseph's control, & Joseph assigned them to guard M. M believed B + J were spying on him. Using pretext that B + J had carried guns in Mosq. 7, M fired B + J, & kicked them out of the Mosq. To get revenge, B + J killed M.

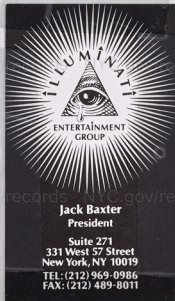
