

deponent was coming out of the
Bohemian Theatre on Third Street
between Avenues A. & B., and said
watch was then contained in the
left coat pocket of the coat then
worn upon deponent's person as a
portion of deponent's bodily clothing,
and was fastened to said coat by
a hair chain. That said

dependants stood at the door of said
Theater and as deponent passed out
the said Geizler struck deponent
and knocked off deponents hat, and
while deponent stooped to pick it up
the said Loser kicked deponent. That
said dependants followed deponent up
while deponent attempted to escape
and the said Loser grasped deponent
by the wrists and forcibly held deponent
while the said Geizler inserted his
hands into the said pocket of said
coat and forcibly stole and carried
away said watch as aforesaid.
