





Q Now, did you ask him if he knew a man named Norman 3X Butler?

A Yes, sir.

A He said he knew him for ~~approx~~ approximately two years from the Mosque 7.

Q And among other questions that you asked him, did you ask him where he had been on February 21, 1965?

HARLEM WANTS TO KNOW!

It was reported by the New York World Telegram and Sun on March 3rd that the Police Department stated:

"They had solved the case" of Malcolm X's Murder. Why, after six months, has there been no trial and only official silence by the District Attorney and the Police Department? On August 11th it was reported by the New York World Telegram and Sun: "Five months ago the three men accused of killing Malcolm X were arrested. Today they are still in the Tombs waiting for a murder trial—a trial one defense lawyer believes may never take place." If the case is "Solved", as stated by the Police Dept. on March 3rd, Why is it that now the trial "may never take place"? What are the District Attorney and the Police Department up to? It was further reported by the Herald Tribune that the Police Department had several "Under Cover Agents" on the scene when Malcolm X was murdered. Now it is reported that the Police Department claims that its informer is "Dead". We find this inexplicable and wonder if there is more to the case than meets the eye. For example: Would an open trial of Malcolm's alleged killers prove internationally embarrassing to the United States? Does Malcolm's murder have international implications? Is the District Attorney trying to wait until the public has lost interest and his evidence is no longer admissible? In cases where Negroes are involved, the Police Department always exercises extreme pressures and diligence to bring the accused before the bar of Justice.

Why have they not acted with equal dispatch in the case of Malcolm X?
