Dear Sir:-

I beg to enclose herewith maps and plans of the City tunnel of the Catskill aqueduct, showing particularly the proposed location at Fort Greene Park in Brooklyn. I enclose also a copy of the Budget Exhibit statement of this Board for October, 1911, in which at page 9 the construction of the City aqueduct is briefly explained.

There will be no reservoir located at Fort Greene Park. One of the terminal shafts (No. 24) is located there. On the completion of the work the water will come through the tunnel and rise up through shaft 24, which at its top will be connected with a pipe line leading to the Borough of Queens. The other terminal shaft is located at Flatbush avenue and Schermerhorn street (Shaft No. 23), and from the top of this shaft the water will pass into a pipe line leading through Brooklyn to Bay Ridge and under the Narrows to the Borough of Richmond.



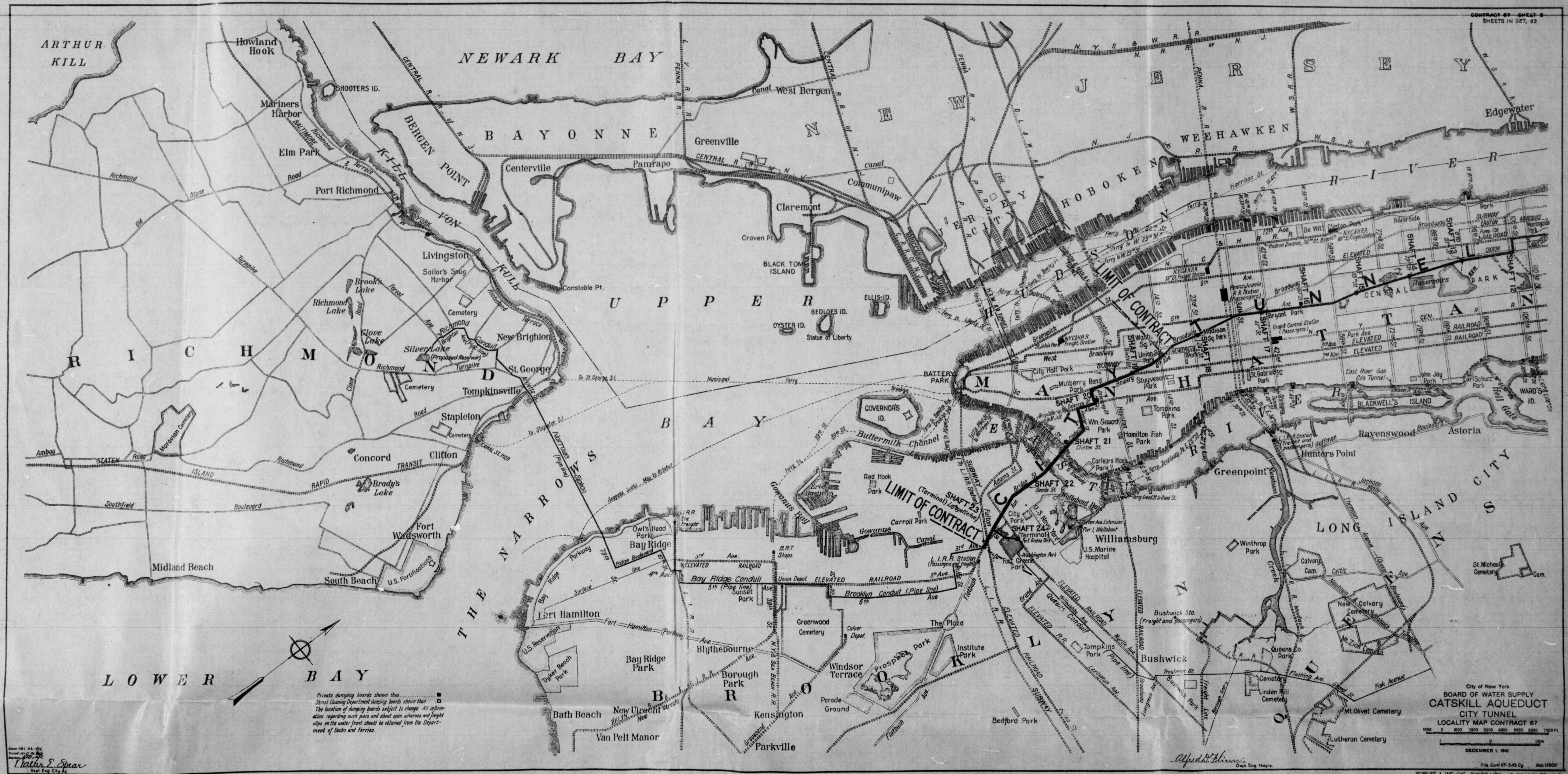

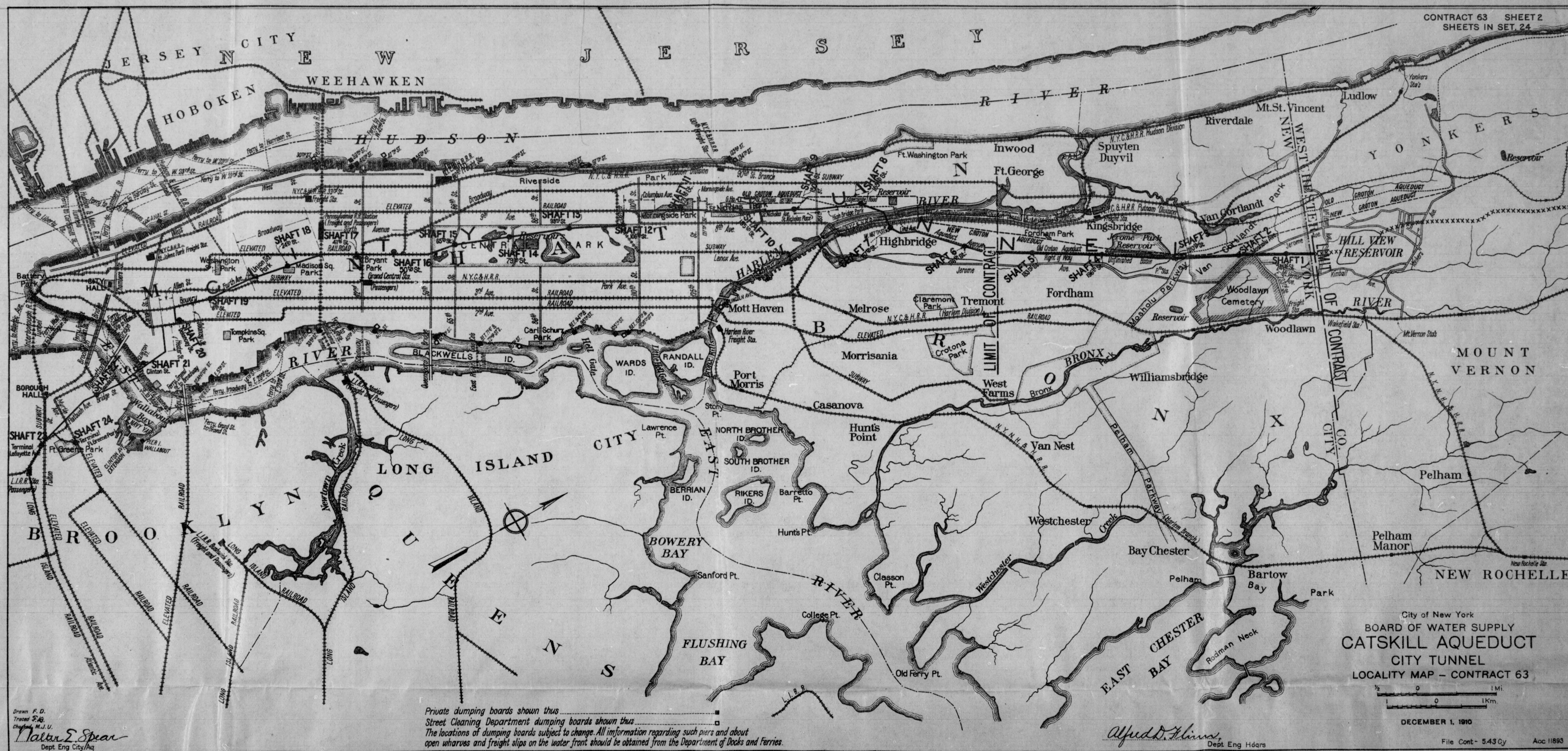
EAST RIVER SIPHON

Position of broken lines showing contacts between rock formations
are speculative; they are reliable only at borings.

appropriate symbols at the borings and by dotted lines between borings
are shown on the profile at the elevations considered most probable,
but The City does not guarantee these elevations as even approximately
correct.

Each prominent depression in the profile
of sound rock probably marks the existence
of a fault; and at tunnel grades more or less
broken rock may be encountered.


