

Charles F. Rillings' s Report.

Grand Central Garden, 152 & 154 42nd. street, near 3rd. Avenue. Went in there Sunday night, June 17'. Found place open. Fifty seven in garden and thirteen in bar room, acting or singing; music, &c.. Sixteen prostitutes. We were there over one hour. Counted some thirty more coming in and going out. There was pool playing also in bar room. We had some whiskey and beer. Admission is 10 cents. Several had whiskey; most of them had lager beer. Had a row while we were there: some drunken fellows quarrelling, but it was soon stopped by the Bouncer, as they call him. He is a sort of private officer to stop any row that may occur in the place or eject any one. Saw the proprietor, Mr. Verailli. He is a stout man; looks like a Frenchman. His head, or forepart of his head is quite bald; has beard. Left there about 10 P. M. ~~there went through the 20' Precinct. Found some soliciting in 21st. street, 20' street and Sixth Avenue, but not as much as on previous occasions. Could's was open Sunday night but open Saturday night until four Sunday morning.~~

Thomas Daly's Report.

Central Garden, 42nd. street and 3rd. Avenue, open Sunday, 17' of June. Had a drink of whiskey and a drink of beer at 10-30 P. M.. About 43 people; 15 women; 14 in pool room playing, mostly boys. One woman sang two songs on stage; also one man two songs. Music, piano, violin and cornet.
