



Whereas the Board of Licenses of the city of New York as authorized by Chapter 481 of the laws of 1892 as amended by Chapter 480 of the laws of 1893, and on the payment of Two hundred Dollars (\$200) as a fee therefore, granted, and on the 12th day of Novr 1895 issued to John Dannecker an License for premises known as 239 E 80th Street under the provision of the law that said license should expire one year from the date of issue thereof: to wit on the 12th day of Novr 1896 and

Whereas under the provision of Chapter 112 of the laws of 1896, said license ceased, determined, became void from & after the 31st day of June 1896, and the holder of said license thereupon became entitled to receive & recover from the city of New York such proportion of the whole license fee paid therefor, as the remainder of the time for which such license would otherwise have run shall bear to the whole period for which it was granted, which said sum is made payable on demand.
