

Action No. 8.

This Instrument made this 4th day of September 1896, between Thomas P. Wood

of the City, County and State of New York, party of the first part and WILLIAM H. NAETHING, of the same place, party of the second part, WITNESSETH:

Whereas, the Board of Excise of the City of New York, upon payment of the legal fee therefor, did grant to the said party of the first part a certain License numbered 4912 for the sale of spiritous liquors in and upon the premises known as No. 2245 Seventh Ave. in said City of New York, which said License bears date the Feb 8th day of February, 1897, and,

Whereas, the period or time for which said License was issued was the full term beginning on the 8th day of February, 1896, and ending upon the 8th day of February, 1897, and by reason of certain laws enacted by the Legislature of the State of New York, the party of the first part was rendered unable to sell liquors at the place aforesaid in accordance with the provisions of said License, and was thereby deprived and debarred from the privileges of said License for the period of 7 months. 8 days.

Now, Therefore, I, the said Thomas P. Wood, party of the first part, in consideration of One Dollars, lawful money of the United States of America, to me in hand paid, and other valuable consideration, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have sold, assigned, transferred and set over, and by these presents do hereby sell, assign, transfer and set over unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, to his and their own proper use and benefit forever, all and singular that certain License No. 4912, issued to me as aforesaid, together with all and singular the money due, or to grow due on account of non-use of the said License to the party of the first part of and for the full term for which the same was granted as aforesaid, that no protest is entered against my License or previous assignment made by me of moneys coming due on said License, or that said License has never been revoked.

And I hereby give to the said party of the second part and to his heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns, full power and authority to ask, demand, collect, receive and give acquittance for the amount of rebate now due or which may hereafter become due upon the said License, and I do hereby authorize the said WILLIAM H. NAETHING to settle or compromise, prosecute and withdraw in my name or otherwise, but at his own proper cost and expense any suit, suits or proceedings at law or in equity for the collection thereof.
