

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

*Fitzgerald Sanford*

of the CRIME OF ASSAULT IN THE FIRST DEGREE, committed as follows :

The said *Fitzgerald Sanford,*

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *fourth* day of *July*, — in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty ~~seven~~, with force and arms, at the City and County aforesaid, in and upon the body of one *Emma Whipple* in the peace of the said People then and there being, feloniously did make an assault, and *then* the said *Emma Whipple,* with a certain *gun - shot* — which the said *Fitzgerald Sanford* — in *his* right hand then and there had and held, the same being a deadly and dangerous weapon then and there wilfully and feloniously did ~~out~~ *stab* and wound,

with intent *then* the said *Emma Whipple,* thereby then and there feloniously and wilfully to kill, against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.

SECOND COUNT;

And the Grand Jury aforesaid, by this indictment, further accuse the said *Fitzgerald Sanford* — of the CRIME OF ASSAULT IN THE SECOND DEGREE, committed as follows :

The said *Fitzgerald Sanford,* —

late of the City and County aforesaid, afterwards, to wit: on the day and in the year aforesaid, at the City and County aforesaid, with force and arms, in and upon the body of the said *Emma Whipple,* — in the peace of the said People then and there being, feloniously did wilfully and wrongfully make another assault, and *then* the said

*Emma Whipple,* — with a certain *gun shot* — which the said *Fitzgerald Sanford* —

in *his* right hand then and there had and held, the same being an instrument and weapon likely to produce grievous bodily harm, then and there feloniously did wilfully and wrongfully ~~out~~ *stab* and wound, against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.


