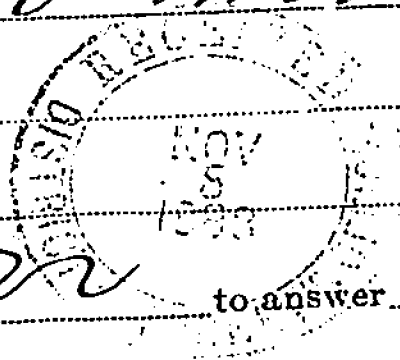

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment, accuse

Gottfried Zunn and John Zunn
of the CRIME OF BURGLARY IN THE THIRD DEGREE,

committed as follows:

The said Gottfried Zunn and John Zunn
late of the South Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York,
aforesaid, on the 29th day of October in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and eighty three with force and arms, at the Ward,
City and County aforesaid, the pigeon coop of

John Henney there situate, feloniously and
burglariously, did break into and enter, the same being a building
in which divers goods, merchandise, and valuable things were then and there kept
for use, sale and deposit, to wit: the goods, chattels, and personal property hereinafter
described, with intent the said goods, chattels, and personal property of the said

John Henney then and there being, then and there
feloniously and burglariously to steal, take and carry away, and twelve
pigeons of the value of
three dollars each

of the goods, chattels and personal property of the said

Henney

so kept as aforesaid in the said pigeon coop then and there being found, then and
there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the Statute in
such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of
New York, and their dignity.

And the Grand Jury aforesaid, by this indictment, further accuse the said

Gottfried Zimm
of the CRIME OF RECEIVING STOLEN GOODS, committed as follows:

The said Gottfried Zimm

late of the Ward, City, and County aforesaid, afterwards, to wit: on the day and in the year aforesaid, with force and arms, at the Ward, City, and County aforesaid, —

twelve packages of the
value of three dollars
each

of the goods, chattels and personal property of Luke Kenney
and one John Zimm and by
other
by a certain person or persons to the Grand Jury aforesaid unknown, then lately before
feloniously stolen of the said Luke Kenney

unlawfully and unjustly, did feloniously receive and have (the said Gottfried
Zimm)

then and there well knowing the said goods, chattels, and personal property to have been feloniously stolen), against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.
