of New York, died at sea March 5th 1937.

March 5th 1937

Chief engineer Frank C. Yandell was found dead in his bed
at 8:00 A.M. by Willie Chatman, messman. Cause of death apparently heart
failure. Ship carried no physician. Ships Position: Lat. 25-05 N. Long. 84-11 W.

March 7th 1937

Body of Frank C. Yandell buried at 7:40 PM at sea in Lat.
31-40 N. Long. 78-46 W. by request of the widow of the deceased.

Frank C. Yandell was born in New Brunswick, Canada April
22nd 1882 and naturalized in U.S. circuit court Boston Mass. May 8th 1905.
He resided at 294 Claremont ave. Montclair N.J. and is survived by the
wife, Ruth Yandell, residing at the same address.

At the time of death, the S.S. Texas Banker was on a voy-
age from Houston Tex. to New York, having left Houston March 2nd and arri-
ved at New York March 10th 1937.
