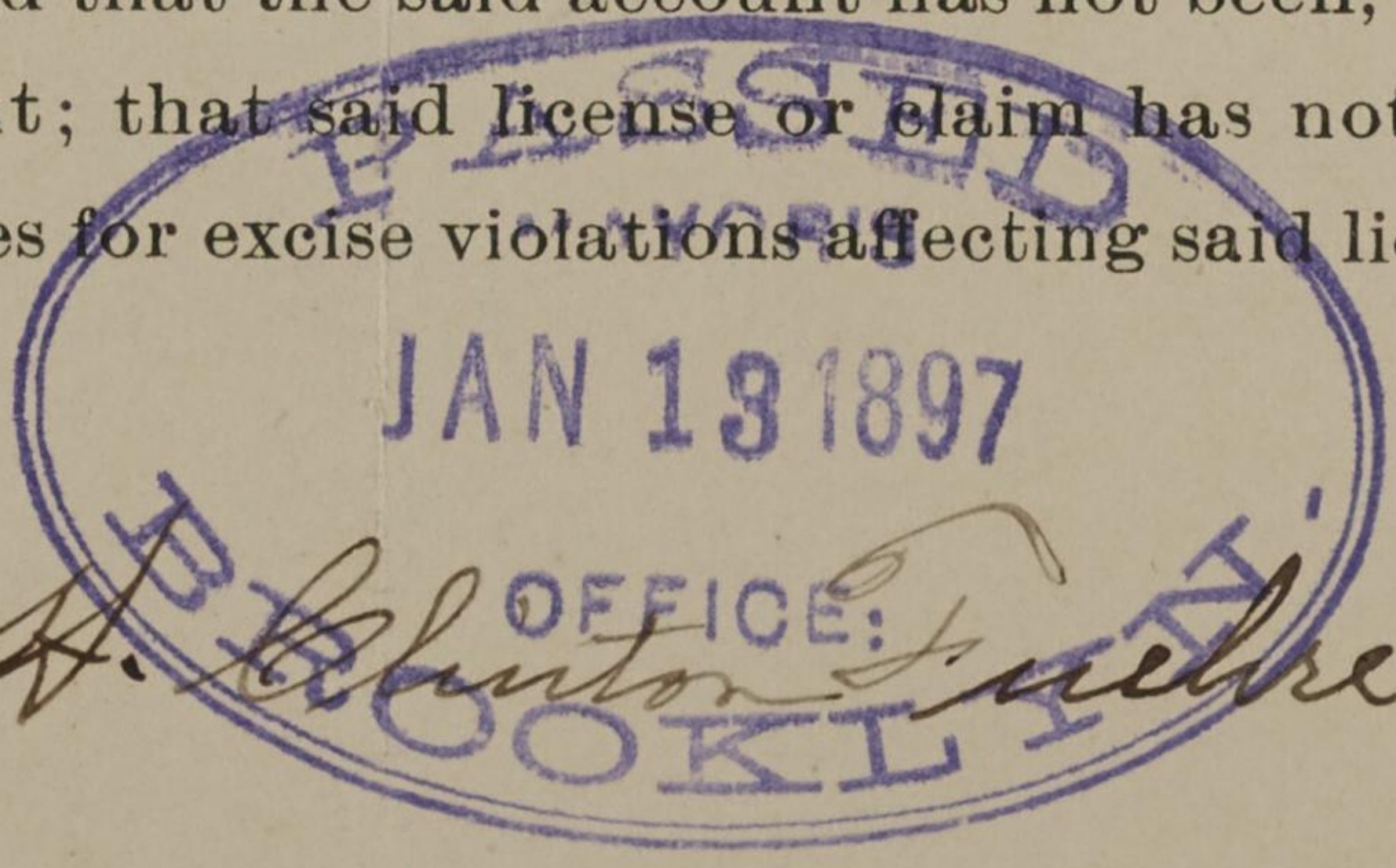

Anthony Felton to traffic in liquors at 152 and 154 Ewen Street
in the City of Brooklyn.

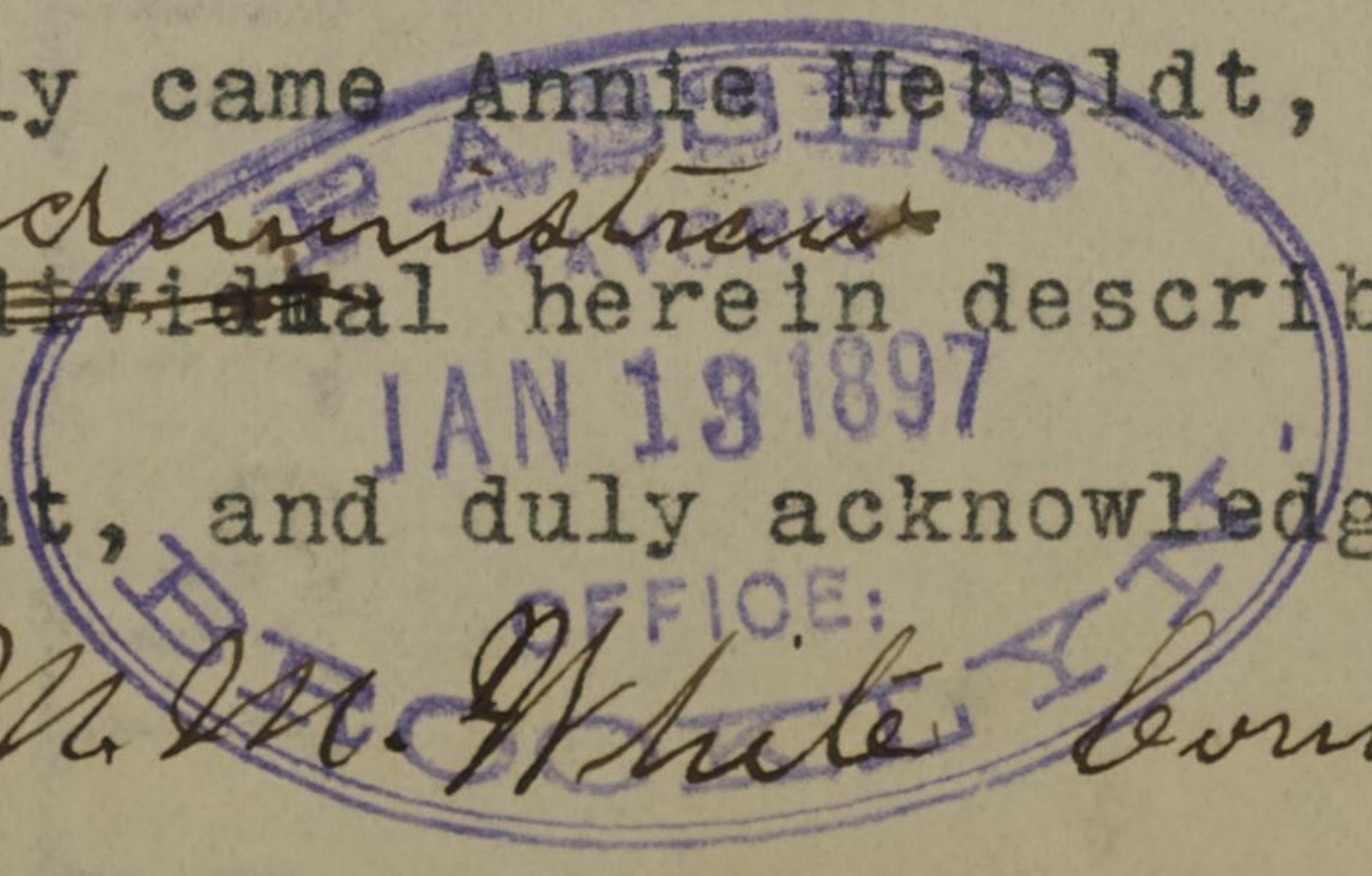
That said License was transferred by Anthony Felton
to Jacob Meboldt ^{on March 23,} ~~in the month of February,~~ 1896. That said
license was terminated on the 30th day of June, 1896, by the
provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of New
York, commonly known as the Raines Law, and under the terms of
said Law said deponent became entitled to a refund of the pro
rata amount of the fee paid for the unexpired portion of said
License, upon demand and surrender of said License.

Deponent further states that she is unable to surren-
der said License, for the reason that same was destroyed by
fire on the 20th day of June, 1896, but that the records of the
late Board of Excise of the City of Brooklyn will show that
said License was issued as deponent claims, and that the same
was never cancelled.
