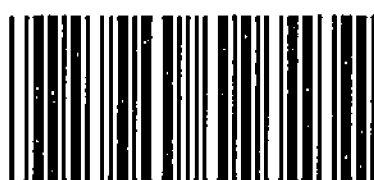

wards, to wit: on the said *fourteenth* day of *December* in  
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty *four* the same being  
the first day of the week, commonly called and known as Sunday, being then and there in  
charge of and having the control of certain premises at number *315*

*East Ninth Street*

in the City and County aforesaid, which said place was then duly licensed as a place for the  
sale of strong and spirituous liquors, wines, ale and beer, with force and arms, at the City and
