of the City, County and State of New York, for value received, have sold, and by these presents do grant, assign and convey unto *Peter Doelger* having its principal place of business in the City of New York in said State, all moneys that are to be paid and received or that may be due and recoverable for the unexpired term of a certain saloon liquor license, class *2* No. *5272* issued by the late Commissioners of Excise of the City of New York, on the *20th* day of *February*, 189*6* to *James Mc Mahon* for use upon the premises No. *640-1 Avenue* in the City of New York,

in my name, place and stead, for the purpose aforesaid, to ask, demand, sue for, attach, levy, recover and receive all such sum and sums of money which now are, or may hereafter become due, owing and payable for or on account of all or any of the accounts, dues, debts and demands above assigned, giving and granting unto the said attorney, full power and authority to do and perform all and every act and thing whatsoever requisite and necessary, as fully to all intents and purposes as I might or could do if personally present, with full power of substitution and revocation, hereby ratifying and confirming all that the said attorney or its substitute shall lawfully do, or cause to be done by virtue hereof.
