



John F. Rumpfer

of the City, County and State of New York, for value received, have sold, and by these presents do grant, assign and convey unto the *Rubsam and Hoffmann Brewing Company*, a domestic corporation having its principal place of business in the City of New York in said State, all moneys that are to be paid and received or that may be due and recoverable for the unexpired term of a certain saloon liquor license, class *2(A.)* No. *3757*, issued by the late Commissioners of Excise of the City of New York, on the *25th* day of *November* 1895, to *Joseph Lackner* for use upon the premises No. *433 East 14th Street* in the City of New York,

Said Excise License having been assigned by the said Joseph Lackner to John F. Rumpfer on the 6th day of December 1895,

which said license expires by its terms on the *25th* day of *November* 1896; together with the right to sue for, receive and recover from the City of New York such proportion of the whole license fee paid for the said license as the remainder of the term for which the said license would have run, were it not for the passage of the liquor tax law, bears to the whole time for which the said license was issued; and also my right, title and interest in and to said license and all moneys due or to become due and payable thereunder, pursuant to Section 4, Chapter 112 of the Laws of 1896, or otherwise.
