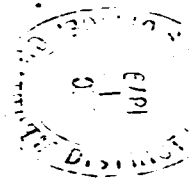

THE JURORS OF THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK,  
in and for the body of the City and County of New York,  
upon their Oath, present:

That

*Frank Steffen.*

late of the *seventh* Ward of the City of New York, in the County  
of New York, aforesaid, on the *twenty sixth* day of *November*  
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy *nine* with force  
and arms, at the Ward, City and County aforesaid, the *store* of  
*Nathan Lachman* there situate, feloniously and  
burglariously, did break into and enter, the same being a building in which divers  
goods, merchandise, and valuable things were then and there kept for use, sale and  
deposit, to wit: the goods, chattels, and personal property hereinafter described, with  
intent the said goods, chattels, and personal property of the said *Nathan*  
*Lachman* then and there therein being, then and there  
feloniously and burglariously to steal, take and carry away, and

*Twelve shirts of the value of one dollar  
and twenty five cents each,*

*Owner goods of the kind commonly called  
lace goods, the number and a description  
of which is to the jurors aforesaid unknown  
and can not now be given of the value  
of Eighty dollars*

of the goods, chattels, and personal property of the said

*Nathan Lachman*

so kept as aforesaid in the said *store* then and there being, then  
and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the Statute in  
such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New  
York, and their dignity.
