
S i r :

I have the honor to transmit herewith to your Honorable Board Labor Report for quarter ended September 30th, 1896.

I wish to invite the attention of your Honorable Board to the progress made in the Tailor Shop and Female Sewing Room: In the former there was made 2,630 articles of clothing whilst 7,758 articles were renovated, repaired and thus rendered serviceable instead of being condemned, while in the latter there was 10,693 articles of Male and Female clothing, sheets, towels, &c manufactured; as well as 5,354 articles renovated and repaired, making a total of 13,323 articles manufactured, 13,112 articles renovated and repaired or a total of 26,435 manufactured and repaired. In consequence of the above, we have to-day a more complete assortment of clothing and bedding of all kinds in a manufactured condition, ready to issued when necessary without outside help, than ever before including outside assistance.
