of No. 1626 Second Avenue Street,

being duly sworn, deposes and says, that
on Tuesday the 23^d day of November

in the year 1880 at the City of New York, in the County of New York

She was violently and feloniously ASSAULTED and BEATEN by George Neumann (nowhere)
who unlawfully, maliciously, and feloniously cut
and stabbed deponent in the left arm,
with a pocket-knife which he said, George,
held in his hand, thereby cutting deponent,
while she was in charge of the store and
premises at said number and street at
about the hour of 5.30, o'clock, P.M., on said
day.

Deponent further says that at the
time she was so assaulted said George,
and four other boys who accompanied him
came into said store and was in the act
of stealing Ham and Sausages and
when she endeavored to prevent them
he said George cut deponent as described
aforesaid. She therefore charges that
said assault so committed was done,

with the felonious intent ~~to take the life of deponent,~~ or to do ^{her} ~~him~~ bodily harm; and without any
justification on the part of the said assailant :

Wherefore this deponent prays that the said assailant may be apprehended and bound to answer
for the above assault, etc., and be dealt with according to law.

That

George Cheuman
late of the City of New York, in the County of New York, aforesaid, on the
twenty third day of *November* in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and eighty with force and arms, at the City and
County aforesaid, in and upon the body of *Minnie Stern*
in the peace of the said people then and there being, feloniously did make an assault
and *her* the said *Minnie Stern*
with a certain *knife*
which the said *George Cheuman*
in *his* right hand then and there had and held, the same being a deadly and
dangerous weapon, willfully and feloniously did beat, strike, stab, cut, and wound
with intent *her* the said *Minnie Stern*
then and there, feloniously and willfully to kill, against the form of the Statute
in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of
New York and their dignity.

SECOND COUNT.

And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their Oath aforesaid, do further present : That
afterwards, to wit, on the day and in the year aforesaid, at the City and County
aforesaid, the said *George Cheuman*
with force and arms, in and upon the body of the said *Minnie Stern*
then and there being, willfully and feloniously did make an
assault and *her* the said *Minnie Stern*
with a certain *knife* which the said *George Cheuman*
in *his* right hand, then and there
had and held, the same being then and there a sharp, dangerous weapon, willfully
and feloniously, and without justifiable and excusable cause, did then and there beat,
strike, stab, cut, and wound, with intent to then and there willfully and feloniously
do bodily harm unto *her* the said *Minnie Stern*
against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the
peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.

THIRD COUNT.

And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their Oath aforesaid, do further present : That
afterwards, to wit, on the day and in the year aforesaid, at the City and County afore-
said, the said *George Cheuman*
with force and arms, in and upon the body of *Minnie Stern*
in the peace of the said people then and there being, feloniously, did make another
assault and *her* the said *Minnie Stern*
with a certain *knife*
which the said *George Cheuman* in *his* right
hand then and there had and held, willfully and feloniously did beat, strike, stab, cut,
and wound, the same being such means and force as was likely to produce the death
of *her* the said *Minnie Stern* with intent *her* the

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said *Minnie Stern* then and there feloniously and willfully to kill, against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.

FOURTH COUNT.

And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their Oath aforesaid, do further present: That afterwards, to wit, on the day and in the year aforesaid, at the City and County aforesaid, the said

George Ahuman with force and arms, in and upon the body of the said *Minnie Stern* then and there being, willfully and feloniously, did make another assault and *her* the said *Minnie Stern* with a certain *knife* which the said *George Ahuman* in *his* right hand then and there had and held, the same being then and there a deadly weapon, willfully and feloniously did then and there beat, strike, stab, cut and wound, with intent to then and there willfully and feloniously maim *her* the said *Minnie Stern* against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.
