At a Court of General Sessions of the Peace, holden in and for the City and County of New York, at the City Hall of the said City, on the seven-teenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety three, before the Honorable Fredericka Comyns, Recorder of the said City and County and Justice of the said Court, the said Franka King was in due form of law convicted of Petit Larceny, upon a certain indictment then and there in the said Court depending against him the said Franka King, by the name and description of Franka King, for that he the said Franka King, then late of the First Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid

on the English day of August in the year
of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred
and eighty three, at the said, City
and County aforesaid, with force and
arms, one promissory note for the
payment of money of the said com=
monwealth of the United States Treasury
notes, the same being then and there
due and unsatisfied, for the payment
of and of the value of five dollars, and
one other promissory note for the pay=
ment of money of the said commonwealth
called State notes, the same being then
and there due and unsatisfied, for the
