Joseph Sweney being duly sworn, deposes and says,
that he is the plaintiff above named, that he signed the
original application for a 2A license to sell liquors at
No. 618 Third Avenue in the City of New York and paid to
the Board of Excise of the City of New York the sum of Two
hundred Dollars for the license that was issued to him,
which was to expire by its terms as according to deponent's
best recollection thereof on the 25th day of November, 1896.

Deponent further says that on the 23rd day of June,
1896, he was taken sick with hemorrhage from the stomach,
and was thus sick for over three weeks before he could atten
to his business. That during his said illness his liquor
license disappeared but as to what become of it he has no
knowledge or information.

Deponent further says that he never sold, assigned,
transferred or set over the said license or any interest
therein or any interest in the rebate due on the said licens
under the Liguor Tax Law, but that deponent is now the
lawful owner and of said rebate and moneys due on said
license.
