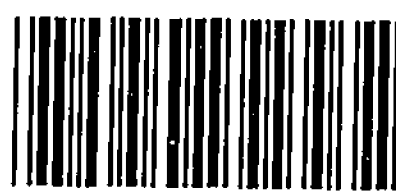

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK

against

Michael Roman

The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment
accuse *Michael Roman*

of the CRIME OF KEEPING OPEN ON SUNDAY a place licensed for the SALE OF STRONG AND
SPIRITUOUS LIQUORS, WINES, ALE AND BEER, committed as follows:

The said *Michael Roman*,

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *17th*
day of *April*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
eighty-seven, the same being the first day of the week, commonly called and known as
Sunday, being then and there in charge of, and having the control of a certain place there
situate which was then duly licensed as a place for the sale of strong and spirituous liquors,
wines, ale and beer, with force and arms, at the City and County aforesaid, the said place, so
licensed as aforesaid, unlawfully did not close, and keep closed, and on the said day, the said
place so licensed as aforesaid, unlawfully did open, and cause and procure, and suffer and
permit, to be open, and to remain open; against the form of the Statute in such case made and
provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York, and their dignity.
