Proof by affidavit having been this day made before me, by William Sanford of 302 Bowery Street, New York City, that there is probable cause for believing that Harry Anderson and John Doe whose real name is unknown but who can be identified by said Sanford -

has in their possession, at, in and upon certain premises occupied by them and situated and known number 124 West Houston Street in said City of New York certain and divers device, establishment, apparatus and articles suitable for gambling purposes, lottery policies, lottery tickets, circulars, writings, papers and documents in the nature of a bet, wager or insurance upon the drawing or drawn numbers of a lottery, books and other documents for the purpose of enabling others to sell lottery policies and other writings, papers and documents, blackboards and gaming tables, with intent to use the same as a means to commit a public offense.

YOU ARE THEREFORE COMMANDED, at any time of the day or night time to make immediate search on the person of the said Harry Anderson and John Doe and in the building situate and known as number 124 West Houston Street aforesaid, for the following property, to wit: 2 Faro layouts, 1 Roulette Wheels and layouts, 2 Rouge et Noir, or Red and Black layouts, 5 gaming tables, 2500 chips, 50 packs of cards, 100 dice, 10 deal boxes, 1000 lottery policies, 1000 lottery tickets, 5000 circulars, and all writings, and papers, and documents in the nature of bets and wagers, or insurance upon the drawings, or drawn numbers of a lottery, and all books and documents for the purpose of enabling others to gamble or sell lottery policies, 5 blackboards, 10000 slips or drawn numbers of a lottery, and all money to gamble with, and all device, establishment, apparatus and articles suitable for gambling purposes.

And if you find the same, or any part thereof, to bring it forthwith before me at the First District Police Court at the Tombs in Centre Street in the City of New York.

William Sanford being of full age, being duly sworn deposes and says, that he resides at the "Rapid Transit Hotel", three hundred and two Bowery in the City of New York, that on the 18th day of July 1884 he personally visited certain premises situated and known as Number 124 West Houston Street in the City and County aforesaid, occupied ^{and used} by one Harry Anderson, as a room, place, and tenement for gambling purposes, and while there saw the gambling game of "Rouge et Noir" or "Red & Black" carried on there in the presence of the said Anderson. That about five o'clock in the morning deponent went to the rooms and premises aforesaid and found the door locked which leads from the hall into the rooms of the said Anderson. Deponent knocked at the door, and the door was opened ~~by~~ and deponent was admitted by the said Anderson, and as the said Anderson admitted deponent, deponent then and there saw the said gambling game of "Rouge et Noir" or "Red & Black" in full blast and saw one John Doe, whose real name to deponent is unknown but who can be identified by deponent, dealing the said gambling game aforesaid. While others played at the same in the presence and knowledge of said Anderson aforesaid.

Deponent further says, that upon divers days and dates between the first day of July and the 18th day of July instant, deponent has visited the said premises ~~so situated~~, known and occupied by said Anderson as aforesaid, and has frequently there seen the said Anderson in charge of said premises, and at the same time has seen the gambling

games of Poker and also Faro set on foot, and dealt and carried on with the knowledge and consent of the said Anderson, who was present on each of said occasions.

Defendant further says from personal observation that he is informed and verily believes that the said Harry Anderson and John Do, ~~et al~~ aforesaid, now have in their possession dice and sundry tables cards, dice, layouts for Rouge et Noir, Faro & Poker, dice, apparatus and paraphernalia for gambling purposes at, in, and upon certain premises, situate and known as Number 124 West Houston Street aforesaid, in the said City & County aforesaid, with intent to use the same as a means to commit a public offense, and against the form of the statutes of the People of the State of New York in such case made and provided, wherefore defendant prays that the said Harry Anderson and John Do may be arrested, their unlawful matters seized and all dealt with according to law.
