The Grand Jury of the City and County of New York, by this indictment accuse

Maggie Ryan

of the CRIME OF ATTEMPTING SUICIDE, committed as follows:

The said *Maggie Ryan*,

late of the City of New York, in the County of New York aforesaid, on the *27th* day of *March*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-*Three*, at the City and County aforesaid, with intent to take *her* own life,

did feloniously drink and swallow down into her body a quantity of a certain deadly poison, commonly known as carbolic acid,

the same being an act dangerous to human life, against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.
