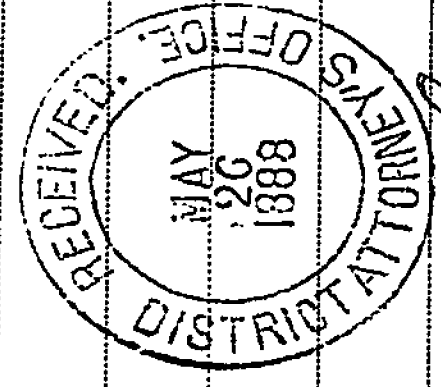

of the CRIME OF BURGLARY IN THE THIRD DEGREE, committed as follows:

late of the *5th* Ward of the City of New York, in the County of New York, aforesaid, on the *Twenty-third* day of *May*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, with force and arms, at the Ward, City and County aforesaid, a certain building there situate, to wit: the *Dwelling* of one

feloniously and burglariously did break into and enter, with intent to commit some crime therein, to wit: with intent, the goods, chattels and personal property of the said

*Walter S. Shepard.* —

in the said *Dwelling* then and there being, then and there feloniously and burglariously to steal, take and carry away, against the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace of the People of the State of New York and their dignity.
